You can't catch that way! by Don Lewis

The holidays are upon us, and lots of people will have received shiny new juggling props that they can almost juggle. They're bound to consult you at some point before they give up in frustration. Patience, and an eagle eye, will get you credit as a juggling guru.

Their throws may be a bit wacky in the beginning, but that usually just leads to the infamous sprinting juggler syndrome. That is easily cured by setting the juggler facing a wall until those errant front throws get under control.

You can't keep throwing if you can't catch the prop to throw it again. Some budding jugglers have a terrible time getting their hands back into the right position for the next catch. A classic problem is reaching up to catch a ball high and early. It makes the pattern speed up and get out of control almost instantly. When your hand is at waist level, it is easy to hold out your hand and have a ball drop into it. If your arm is reaching up, your wrist can't bend to flatten out your hand. The result is that the ball rolls out of your hand before you've actually caught it. Even if you do manage to hang onto the ball, it is way out of position for the next throw.

A good exercise to fix that kind of problem is to stand in front of the juggler, about a foot away and throw three balls up slowly in sequence, right, left, right. The other juggler catches them, and then throws them back. Start slowly and make the other person put their hand in the right position to catch before each throw you make. Gradually speed up the exercise while making sure the catching hands stay in the right position. It is a question of getting that catching instinct into muscle memory. Curiously, I have seen people who could not really juggle three balls, work up to five balls between partners, and still not be convinced that they can juggle three.

The same sort of thing happens with beginning club passers. You can actually get a person who can't yet juggle three clubs to do some simple right/left passing patterns. But they can't do it at all if they can't catch the clubs. The typical exercise for the budding club passer is to work up to a three club chase, starting with one club. First, the catcher stands facing their partner with their hand at about shoulder height, palm facing front, thumb up. You throw a perfect pass, the handle hits their palm, the fingers close around it, perfect catch. Now you need to get them to throw that club as a self, and get their hand back into the catching position.

It does not always happen that easily. Frequently, you will find that they make a good first catch and then throw the club, and start waving their hand all over the place in a semi panic because the next club is on its way. Sometimes they'll try to catch the next club as if it were a ball. You won't get very far like that, and there are bound to be some very sore hands from being whacked by an incoming club. Fortunately this problem is usually easy and quick to fix once you see what is happening. Just slow the whole thing down. Don't throw the next club until their catching hand is in the right position.

They will look at you in confusion because you are not throwing anything, totally oblivious to the fact that their hand is anywhere but where it should be. A nod or a word will get that hand where it should be. Don't throw until the hand is in the right position. They have to get used to the idea of rotating from the self throw up into position to catch the next pass. Gradually speed up the exercise. It should take about five minutes to get the hand

instinctively into the catching position.


The three club chase is an excellent exercise. In addition to installing good catching instincts, you can work on getting self throws sufficiently wide. Jugglers who have learned three clubs by themselves tend to have a very narrow pattern. That is a problem for club passing because you need enough room to throw a pass while the self pass is coming across the pattern. A narrow pattern forces the passer to bend the pass inside the incoming self throw. The pass often tends toward the middle of the receiver's pattern - right between the eyes! Fixing that in a beginning club passer is an exercise in self preservation that we'll all appreciate.


