EDITORS NOTEBOOK

The front page of this Newsletter is an example of a technicue I have used on occassion-the use of original copy (post cards, letters and letterheads, printed articles, etc.,) for the "master" of the Newsletter pages. This technicue has several advantages. It makes the composition of the page faster and easier for me. It makes for more interesting looking copy, and it allows you to share with me the fun of receiving letters and cards from all over the world with the interesting letterheads and signatures remaining intact.

This technique is more expensive from the standpoint of the extra space used up, but I think it is worth it-don't you?
